Minutes

Chairman Olds presented to the Board the minutes of December 5, 2019 for approval.

Dan Clark noted the Ordinance Review has passed an ordinance prohibiting certain outdoor lighting and regulation of the same which were subsequently passed by the City Council.

Dan Clark stated noted they will be incorporated in our ordinance book.

MASTER PLAN:

Fred Olds updated Commission on status of the Master Plan and noted individual members were yet in the process of contacting various advisory boards of the city for input.

Malik noted he had met with members of the Beautification Committee to discuss their long-term goals which included extending plantings along our parks, particularly Three Mile Park, and expanding the tree planting program throughout the City.

Resident recommended reaching out to the community to gain additional input for the development of the Master Plan.

Gaskin indicated he appreciated and welcomed all input and noted the committee has been soliciting input from the city's website along with encouraging people through the communicator to offer input.

Resident suggested events at the parks and at the schools to solicit additional comments.

Gaskin noted the City newsletter touches on all homes and with easy website access providing communication to the committee can be easily undertaken. He inquired specifically what would she like to see addressed or incorporated in the Master Plan and what suggestions does she have going forward.

Resident noted she would forward correspondence on the same.

Mayor Denner noted Public Service Committee met & offered several suggestions regarding the Master Plan review and city infrastructure.

Chairman Old's noted as the City is 98% developed and limited opportunities are available as a result. He recommends we continue to fine tune the plan in place and incorporate long term goals relative and enhancing services for our residents along with providing opportunities where possible to attract new residences.

The Board scheduled April 24th as the next meeting date, unless it is necessary to reschedule.
