

**CITY OF GROSSE POINTE PARK**

**Resolution Approving Proposal Language for New Millage for Water And Sewer  
Infrastructure**

**At a regular meeting of the City Council for the City of Grosse Pointe Park, Michigan, held in the City Hall on the 18 day of July, 2022 at 7:00 PM, Eastern Time.**

**Present Members: Councilmembers Brenner, Gallagher, Wiener, Relan and McMillan, and Mayor Hodges.**

**Absent Members: Councilmember Caulfield**

**Motion by Councilmember Wiener, seconded by Councilmember Brenner to adopt the following resolution:**

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Grosse Pointe Park has determined a new additional millage on taxable property within the city for the purposes of maintaining, repairing, replacing, and enhancing water and sewer systems and related infrastructure in the city is necessary to preserve and improve the quality of life for current and future residents;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the following proposition (Proposition No. 1) be placed before the duly qualified electors of the City of Grosse Pointe Park in the November 8, 2022 general state election:

“Shall the City of Grosse Pointe Park, Michigan be authorized to levy a new additional millage on the taxable property within the City not to exceed the annual rate of 2.5 mills (\$2.50 per thousand dollars of taxable value) for a period of 10 years, beginning with the December 2022 levy and extending through the December 2032 levy, for the purpose of maintaining, repairing, replacing, and enhancing water and sewer systems and related infrastructure in the city? Projects may include work on water mains, lead service lines, sewer mains, pump stations, sewer pipe and manhole rehabilitation, improving sewer resilience and drainage, and upgrading public works water/sewer equipment and associated restoration. The estimated amount of revenue that will be collected in the first year that the millage is authorized and levied is \$1,758,292.00.”

At a Council meeting held on July 18, 2022, and after discussion, the following roll call vote was taken:

AYES: Councilmembers Brenner, Wiener, Relan and McMillan, and Mayor Hodges.

NAYS: Councilmember Gallagher.

EXCUSED: Councilmember Caulfield.

**PROPOSITION NO. 1**

Shall the City of Grosse Pointe Park, Michigan be authorized to levy a new additional millage on the taxable property within the City not to exceed the annual rate of 2.5 mills (\$2.50 per thousand dollars of taxable value) for a period of 10 years, beginning with the December 2022 levy and extending through the December 2032 levy, for the purpose of maintaining, repairing, replacing, and enhancing water and sewer systems and related infrastructure in the city? Projects may include work on water mains, lead service lines, sewer mains, pump stations, sewer pipe and manhole rehabilitation, improving sewer resilience and drainage, and upgrading public works water/sewer equipment and associated restoration.
