



Notice to Residents

Re: Emergency Relief Sewer System - City of Grosse Pointe Park

Dear Homeowner/Resident:

This letter is written to update you on the status of the emergency relief sewer project within and around Matthew C. Patterson Park. This \$2.8M project is funded by the City's Infrastructure Millage and Philanthropic Donations.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The majority of work on the project was completed in 2023; however, the underground flow control structure, restoration of the Essex/Three Mile intersection and restoration of the park have yet to be completed. The upcoming work will mainly focus around the entryway to Patterson Park, as well the previous areas that were impacted by construction.

WHEN: The project began in Fall 2023. The final phase of this project will commence this week and while the bulk of the work will be completed this spring, some restoration work will extend into late spring/early summer.

You may notice that some pre-construction activities, including material and equipment delivery has already begun.

WHAT TO EXPECT:

- **PARK VISITORS:** For the majority of this phase of the project, the park will remain open as normal. However, visitors should expect increased delays when entering or exiting the park, as the bulk of the contractor's work will be around this area. There will be some instances where the park may need to close for short periods. The contractor will coordinate with the City such that events/services are not interrupted.
- **RESIDENTS:** Residents will likely see construction traffic within their neighborhood during working hours (7 AM-6 PM, Monday through Friday). Additionally, due to the nature of the work, a full closure of 3 Mile Drive and Essex Drive intersection will be required. Residents will not be able to drive through this intersection. Advanced warning signage will be installed prior to the implementation of this closure.

TRAFFIC: During construction, you may experience situations where portions of the park & surrounding roads are not accessible for a short period of time. Please be patient during these times when access is not readily available. Advanced notice will be given when full park closures are required.
